For those of you unable to attend, I'll tell you a little more about it. Over 60 people were there and we were very honoured by the guests who attended. During her presidency, she has made a special effort to attend individual Auxiliary AGMs and she was off to St. Catherines after ours! Leslee Thompson made a special effort to be there as it was the last AGM she would be able to attend as CEO. The KGH Board chair, Scott Carson, Board Liaison, Diane Kelly and Shannon Graham (who is retiring in January) were also in attendance. Guests Jane Batey (HAAO S.E. Region Chair) and Sharon Suddergaard (Volunteer Services to Hotel Dieu President) both gave the Auxiliary their congratulations in reaching the grand age of 110 years and Sharon presented the Auxiliary with a beautiful flower arrangement to celebrate the occasion. This has graced the volunteer office over the past week and the orchids were still doing well a week later.

We presented a cheque to Leslee Thompson and Scott Carson for \$469,600 on behalf of the Auxiliary. Of this, \$408,000 will be used to purchase equipment to be decided later this summer. As in years past the Auxiliary also supports several Departments within KGH including Pediatrics with proceeds from the 2014 Teddy Bear campaign and a renal dialysis unit from the 2015 Golf Tournament proceeds. In addition the Auxiliary is supporting the Sexual/Domestic Assault Program, Social Work Patient Fund, Volunteer Services, Kidd 9 Compassion supplies and the Beads of Courage program for children undergoing treatment at KGH - totalling \$9,600.00.

Life Members, Joan Adamson, Barbara Cogan and Alberta Saunders. We hope they will be able to attend the HAAO banquet in Toronto in November. Other award recipients are noted below.
