### "ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END"

So says the **KGHA Golf Committee** and The KGHA Board and Council, quoting Chaucer. After 15 years, members of the Golf Committee have decided that 2015 will be recorded as its final golf tournament. In 15 years the golf tournaments raised well over half a million dollars for the hospital - \$519,480.17 to be exact.

The first golf tournament was held in May 2001, with proceeds going to the KGH Auxiliary Millennium Endowment Fund, which was established by the Auxiliary in December 1999, to mark the occasion of the new millennium.

The Auxiliary fattened the fund in February 2003 with \$200,000 raised primarily by the golf tournament. Since then The Auxiliary has given \$69,668 in bursaries to health professionals at Kingston General Hospital.

After the Endowment Fund was established, monies raised from the golf tournament went to purchase programs and equipment for KGH. Included among these were funding for Surgical Suites, The Mental Health Unit, Chemotherapy Chairs for the Cancer Clinic, and for the last several years, Dialysis Chairs for the Renal Unit.

Among the many reasons for choosing to cancel the tournament are the increased number of other charity tournaments which have impacted our ability to attract and keep sponsors and golfers. We have had a wonderful group of dedicated volunteers who contributed to the success of the tournament over the past decadeand-a-half. To all of them - we express our thanks.

### IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Estelle Salamon joined the KGH Auxiliary in 1984 and became the Treasurer of the Auxiliary in 1985. She served for 2 years in this capacity and was also a cashier in the Gift Shop from 1986 until 2010. She performed many functions in the hospital, mainly with the Auxiliary, but also volunteered on the Information Desk, Hand Washing Stations and Elder Life, Pet Therapy and Lottery Booth.

Estelle was in at the beginning of the Cash Draw and worked on this until it ceased in 2010. After she met and married John, she recruited him to join the Committee. He assisted her in delivering Christmas ornaments on Christmas Eve until his death a few years ago but Estelle continues to this day. She has convened Patient Comforts since 1996, providing kits with toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs and an Auxiliary bookmark to

patients in need. Estelle has served on the Board and Council for 14 years in this capacity. She has also been a member of the Family Service Committee since 2009 and does regular duty there ensuring that supplies are on hand and the rooms in good order. Besides these duties, she volunteers at the Christmas Bazaar, Staff Appreciation Tea, Bridge luncheon and at the Golf Tournament.

In 2005, Estelle received her Provincial Life Membership in 1996, an Outstanding Service pin 2005. and became the Honorary President in 2010 for a 2 year term. This is in addition to serving as the actual President in 1990 to 1992. The Mrs. J. C. Connell award was presented to Estelle in 2014. This is the highest honour of our own Auxiliary. She has also received two Ministry of Citizenship awards, one in 2011 for 25 years and the second in 2015 for her 30 years of service. This November, Estelle was presented with her pin for 30 years of service of volunteering at KGH.
