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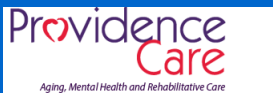

Construction begins on W.J. Henderson Centre for Patient-Oriented Research



Construction officially began on July 18 on the W.J. Henderson Centre for Patient-Oriented Research. Located within the Connell 4 wing, this 10,000 square foot facility will house 3 meeting rooms, 2 interview rooms, 7 exam/procedure rooms, 3 overnight beds for Phase 1/2 clinical trials, 4 infusion chairs, centrifuge and freezer rooms, waiting and lounge areas for participants, caregivers and family members, a staff kitchen, and two research labs.

Construction is expected to be finished by late April 2017. “The creation of the W.J. Henderson Centre for Patient-Oriented Research will be a game-changer for research in our region,” says Dr. Roger Deeley, Vice President of Health Sciences Research at KGH and President of the KGH Research Institute. “It will enable the development of new treatments and treatment guidelines, and new diagnostic tests and procedures, which will ultimately result in improved patient care within Kingston and beyond.”

The Centre is made possible through funding from the Canada Foundation for Innovation and through the generosity of more than 160 local donors.

Introduction to Clinical Trials Training Program

The Association of Clinical Research Professionals (ACRP) now offers a free online course for clinical research. This one-hour “*Introduction to Clinical Trials*” provides fundamental education about how clinical research advances medical knowledge. Topics include how medical products are developed, how volunteer patients are protected, and who plays key roles in the development, research, review, and approval of medical products. It also explores how historical studies have laid the path for creation, revision, and enforcement of the ethical principles and guidelines governing today's clinical trials.
