Erin O'Shaughnessy

Erin is a nurse practitioner with 35 years experience in a variety of healthcare settings. She holds an undergraduate nursing degree from the University of Manitoba and a master's degree from York University. She completed her nurse practitioner diploma at the University of Ottawa.
