Had household contact (or similar high risk contact*) with a confirmed case of COVID-19; OR		Notify Occupational Health, Safety & Wellness (OHSW) – KGH site x4389 (open 0700-1600); HDH site x2265 (open 0800-1600). If you are a household/high risk contact of a positive COVID-19 case, regardless of your vaccination status, you are required to self-quarantine and speak with OHSW.
 Had high risk contact* with someone who is experiencing new COVID-19 symptoms who has not received a negative test result, and I am not fully vaccinated 		If you are not fully vaccinated, your symptomatic high risk must either have a negative COVID-19 swab, or their symptoms must be determined by their treating health care practitioner to be unrelated to COVID-19 before you can return to the workplace.
		*high risk, as defined by OHS or Public Health, or as having provided care, having had similar close physical contact, or having had close, prolonged contact (i.e. within 6 feet for > 10-15 minutes) without appropriate PPE. Fully vaccinated means you've been vaccinated for at least 14 days

If Yes→	DO NOT ENTER THE WORKPLACE and SELF-QUARANTINE Notify your Manager, and phone the Absence Reporting line x7425 if this is the usual protocol for you. Contact OHSW. KGH site x4389 (open 0700-1600); HDH site x2265 (open 0800-1600). Those who have had a positive test using a rapid antigen test or home based self-test are required to first have the result confirmed with a laboratory (PCR) test prior to being able to return to work. OHSW can schedule you in for a lab based (PCR) test.

4.	In the last 14 days I have returned from travel outside of Canada and been informed a federal quarantine period is required.	If Yes→	Notify your Manager, and phone the Absence Reporting line x7425 if this is the usual protocol for you. Self-quarantine for the required period and monitor for symptoms. Should you develop any new symptoms of acute illness while off work on quarantine promptly report to OHSW; OHSW will assess and direct you for COVID-19 swabbing if testing is advised

5.	I am NOT compliant with KHSC Mandatory Vaccination Policy requiring all staff to be fully vaccinated** (unless I have an approved exemption) or I am awaiting my second dose, in which case a weekly COVID-19 rapid antigen test must be done.	If Yes →	All KHSC staff and physicians must be fully vaccinated (vaccinated x 14 days with the second dose) <u>unless</u> they have either an approved medical or approved Human Rights exemption, or have been vaccinated with their first dose of the vaccine and are awaiting their scheduled second dose. For any of these staff, they MUST conduct a weekly COVID-19 swab test and submit the result to: https://antigentestsubmission.kingstonhsc.ca OR Sean.Bradley@kingstonHSC.ca . Where a weekly test has not been done, the staff member is not permitted to enter the workplace.

- 6. If any of the following apply to you, please SCAN STOP; you may work but are required to be on Work Isolation:
 - I have returned from travel outside of Canada in the past 14 days (travel to the United States for less than 12 hours is excluded); OR
 - I am a fully vaccinated and have a household contact that is experiencing new COVID-19 symptoms who has not yet had a COVID-19 test OR I have a household contact who is a contact of a positive COVID-19 case; OR
 - I have been informed that I may have had contact with a positive COVID-19 case at a specific location or social event in the community; OR
 - Someone I live with has returned from international travel in the past 14 days;
 OR
 - Occupational Health, Safety & Wellness (OHSW) has instructed you to be on work isolation.

YOU CAN BE IN THE WORKPLACE BUT MUST BE ON WORK ISOLATION

Stay on work isolation for 10 days after your last exposure to the COVID-19 risk or confirmed positive case; (unless Occupational Health has informed you otherwise)

Obtain the **Work Isolation document** at screening which gives you instructions for work isolation.

If you are returning from international travel (travel to the USA less than 12 hours is excluded), you must also be complaint with the following in order to be in the workplace:

- You must have had a negative laboratory based (PCR) COVID-19 test no earlier than 48 hours prior to traveling home; and
- You must do daily rapid antigen testing for 10 days.

If you are fully vaccinated but have a household contact that is experiencing new COVID-19 symptoms who has not yet had a COVID-19 test **OR** your household contact is a contact of a positive COVID-19 case, you must also do rapid antigen testing until your household contact has an initial negative PCR test

If you have been informed that you may have had contact with a positive COVID-19 case at a specific location or social event in the community, you also must do daily rapid antigen testing for 10 days after your exposure.

Rapid antigen test kits can be obtained from the main entrance screening stations at HDH (Jeanne Mance 1) or KGH (Kidd Davies1) or from OHSW.
