<ul> <li>Had high risk contact* with someone who is experiencing new COVID-19 symptoms who has not received a negative test result, and I am not fully vaccinated</li> </ul>		If you are a household contact of a positive COVID-19 case, regardless of your vaccination status, you are required to self- quarantine and speak with OHSW. <b>Note-</b> Fully vaccinated staff may be permitted to RTW on work isolation with daily COVID-19 rapid antigen testing, depending on the situation and whether the staff member is CRITICAL to staffing.
		If you are <u>not fully vaccinated</u> , your symptomatic high risk contact must either have a negative COVID-19 swab, or their symptoms must be determined by their treating health care practitioner to be unrelated to COVID-19 <u>before you can return to the workplace</u> .
		*high risk, as defined by OHS or Public Health, or as having provided care, having had similar close physical contact, or having had close, prolonged contact (i.e. within 6 feet for > 10-15 minutes) without appropriate PPE.
		Fully vaccinated means you've been vaccinated for at least 14 days with your <u>second</u> Covid-19 vaccine.
