



# **Esophageal Motility Study**

## Why am I having this procedure?

This procedure will help your doctor determine the reasons for your problems with food sticking, or to assess whether you should have surgery for Acid Reflux disease.

# What will happen during the procedure?

- You will **not** be sedated for this procedure.
- A soft, flexible tube will be inserted through your nose and passed down your esophagus into your stomach.
- You will take small sips of water to help the tube go down.
- We will measure the action of muscles in your esophagus when you swallow.

#### Instructions

- Do not have anything to eat or drink for **6 hours** before your appointment.
- If you normally take prescription medications you can take these on the morning of your appointment, with a small sip of water, unless instructed otherwise by your doctor.

# **Possible Side Effects**

- There is a small possibility that the tube could cause a tear or perforation of your esophagus, however this is very rare. If these were to occur, you might need surgery.
- It is possible that the tube could trigger a nose bleed.
- Passage of the tube may irritate your nose and throat and may cause gagging.
