

COVID-19 Quick Reference for Staff & Physicians

This guidance applies to vaccinated individuals (minimum of 2 doses); if you are unvaccinated, contact Occupational Health, Safety & Wellness (OHSW). Where a staff member doesn't normally work from home, they require approval from their leader to do so. Where a PCR test is required- schedule your same day appointment at Beechgrove Assessment Centre- call **613-548-2376 or** <u>book online</u> Effective July 1, 2022, when the Assessment Centre will be closed on weekends and statutory holidays, staff can pick up and drop off a PCR self-swab from the KGH main entrance (Kidd Davies 1) between the hours of 12pm and 3 pm

Those who cannot work from home should discuss timelines and requirements for return to work with OHSW; the timeline for return for most staff will be on <u>Day 7</u> of their isolation period provided symptoms have mostly resolved. <u>Exception: earliest return for staff in the NICU, peds</u> <u>ICU, and inpatient</u> <u>oncology is Day 8.</u> For critical staffing shortages, staff with COVID-19 could be asked to return sooner. Important Notes:

You can obtain COVID-19 test results from the COVID portal (<u>https://covid-19.ontario.ca/</u>); results are usually available within 24 hours.

Staff can schedule themselves and their household members at the COVID-19 Assessment Centre (Beechgrove) by calling 613-548-2376, or by booking online https://ygkcovidtesting.coconutcalendar.com/service. If they are unable to get an appointment, contact OHSW. The COVID-19 Assessment Centre is closed on weekends and statutory holidays but staff can pick up & drop off a PCR self-swab from KGH main entrance (Kidd Davies 1) 12-3 pm

If you fail any screening questions, you <u>cannot attend work</u> and must contact OHSW.

Where you are unable to work you MUST notify your Manager and/or the Staffing Office as per usual practice.

If you are COVID-19 positive, you must inform OHSW
