



# DRESS CODE FOR VOLUNTEERS

KHSC strives to provide a workplace environment where staff and volunteers feel comfortable and safe while dressed accordingly.

The Dress Code policy outlines standards to promote a consistent, professional image throughout the hospital. All hospital staff & volunteers should be viewed as professional & competent from the perspective of the patient and family and compliant with occupational health and safety regulations, identification and infection control policies.

Clothing must be in good condition, clean and appropriately fitted with your I.D. badge properly placed at chest level.

Although the guidelines allow for a wide range of apparel options, some clothing & accessories are not suitable for the work environment at any time of the year.
