TEDDY BEAR CAMPAIGN 2023 – Heather Breck

The 2023 Teddy Bear Campaign will launch in the Watkins Lobby on Monday, November 6 at 11:00 a.m. This is our first in-person event at KGH since modifying the campaign due to Covid-19 restrictions. This is our 20th campaign, and we are hoping to raise \$25,000 which will help us surpass \$500,000 in total funds raised for pediatric equipment at KGH. More than 300 white 'Sentiments' bears will be delivered to young patients at the end of the campaign. Again, this year, we have the support of the Royal Canadian Legion 560 and their Ladies Auxiliary. Their donation will cover the costs of the campaign so that 100% of funds raised will go directly to purchasing the equipment. CHRISTMAS BAZAAR

For the first time since the pandemic was declared, we will be holding our annual Bazaar on November 22nd from 10 - 1. This will be a little different from previous years, but we hope to draw a good crowd. As no other space is available, the event will be held on Kidd/Davis 0, adjacent to the Atrium Cafeteria and will be limited in scope and items offered. There will be no Silent Auction this year, and no refreshments. We will have second-hand jewelry, knitted and hand-made goods, baking and a section with miscellaneous items including Christmas wreaths and other seasonal goods. Donations of baked goods and candy would be very much appreciated and may be dropped off at the main entrance beginning Monday, November 20th. The Gift Shop will offer a discount of 15% on that day.

Seating in the Café is down from 99 pre-pandemic to below 60 but it is felt that this provides a comfortable and uncrowded seating arrangement. The cafeteria downstairs is now closed in the evenings and at weekends, which has increased our business during those times while things remain steady during the week. Although sales are up, so are food prices and our payroll. Additionally, it has been necessary to purchase some new equipment that

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is efficient and not ready to fall apart. Due to the school year starting, our student workers have moved to parttime from full-time summer hours, so our Manager is looking for new full-time and part time workers. Although things may be looking a little challenging to our bottom line now, our committee is hopeful that business will continue to do well and, with the increase in our prices, that we still have to time to recover.

The Gift and Tuck Shops are both doing well. As the hospital reopened, customers increased in both shops. The Online Store (shop.kingstongeneralgiftshop.ca) has continued and is appreciated by patients and their family or friends who are unable to visit in person. Fall Fashions and accessories are arriving in the Gift Shop. Capes, tops, pants, sweaters, scarves, hats, and handbags in many styles and colours. We have an attractive selection of jewelry, and the Oxford Station earrings are the most popular jewellery item. The personal care line from Relaxus has several new products. A new Canadian company specializing in all natural products has an interesting line of personal care soap and skin lotion as well as an all-natural laundry powder. Many new gift items, plush toys, books, and baby items are now available in the shop. The Tuck Shop continues to be busy with regular and flavoured coffee, baked treats, sandwiches and wraps from the Golden Rooster. Donations of used books are always welcome. Dry cleaning services have resumed.
