Through the donor wall, KHSC will offer families the opportunity to remember a loved one who consented to give the gift of life through organ and tissue donation. - The Organ and Tissue Donor memorial wall provides thanks and recognition to those who pursued the gift of donation, at no cost to the family
- KHSC was recognized as one of 10 hospitals in Ontario to achieve a 100 per cent conversion rate for potential donors that became actual organ donors
- One donor can save up to 8 lives and enhance as many as 75 lives through tissue donation.
- There are 1,500 men, women and children in Ontario waiting for a life-saving organ.
- A signed donor card doesn't mean you're registered. You can check your status at www.BeADonor.ca.
- Anyone 16 years or older with an Ontario Health Card can register their consent to be an organ and tissue donor.
